ANTI-MATCH-FIXING & SPORTS BETTING POLICY

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1 Introduction

- 1.1 Gliding New Zealand (GNZ) is committed to maintaining the fundamental character of sporting competition as an honest test of skill and ability to prevent match-fixing and/or sports betting undermining the integrity of gliding.
- 1.2 The purpose of this Advisory Circular is to state GNZ's policy regarding match-fixing and sports betting, which is to comply with the advice on competition manipulation given by the Sport Integrity Commission Te Kahu Raunui (the Commission); and to educate members about it.
- 1.3 This policy applies to Contest Directors, Scorers and competitors at GNZ sanctioned events; pilots and Team Captains selected to represent NZ at international events; and members of the Sailplane Racing Committee.

3 Raising an Issue

- 3.1 The earlier an issue is raised, the more likely the issue can be resolved, and further conflict and stress can be avoided. Any member of a GNZ affiliated Club can raise the issue directly with the person concerned if that seems appropriate in the circumstances, which may elicit an acceptable explanation or an apology. Alternatively, the relevant Club President or the GNZ President may be consulted for advice.
