Minutes of prior contest pilots meeting OMA December 09 read (abridged)

Discussion items:

CLUB CLASS

D Dickinson presented the SRC proposal:

- That the Club Class Nationals be held as a separate event to the Multiclass Nationals
- That the Club Class Nationals be merged into an existing event on the completion calendar
- That the event be alternated between the North & South Islands but be held in the Island not hosting the Multiclass Nationals
- That there be unrestricted entry with respect to gliders, however the winners will be from gliders eligible for club class under the current GNZ handicap rules
- That there be no water ballasting
- That motorgliders carry a 2% handicap loading
- That the completion be of a 7 to 9 day duration
- That the current rule that 2/3rds of task be racing or AAT be abolished for the Club Class Nationals

Discussion:

R Gaddes : Drury completion held recently was a test for tasking a wide range of gliders on a single task. It was found that AAT's were required & that tasking for gliders below the performance of current Club Class handicaps was difficult. Task difficulty should be directed a sailplane performance rather than pilot ability.

M Wilson : Concerned that current tasks not set high enough to encourage entry of experienced pilots

D Dickinson : Potential for prizes/prize money

W Dickinson : Pilots with high performance gliders will not want to fly tasks aimed at club class gliders

M Morley : Clubs own a lot of eligible gliders & should be encouraged to put forward pilots & gliders

C Richards : Twin seat entries should be encouraged

D Dickinson : Lower limit of handicap range be set so as not to endanger sports class

I Finlayson : Up to individual clubs to generate enthusiasm amongst new pilots to enter club Class

Proposed (D Dickinson)

That the Club Class Championships be separated from the Multiclass Championships and that they may be held in alternate islands which are not hosting the Multiclass Championships.

Seconded D Jensen

Carried (unanimous)

Proposed (B Hunter)

That the Duo Discus and the DG1000 in 20m span be no longer eligible for entry in the standard class.

Seconded B Mace

Carried (4 against)

20m Two seat Class

D Dickinson explained the possible emergence of a 20m two seat class

Proposed (R Edwards)

Remove from rule 1.1.3 the clause "That the contest start on a Monday & finish on a Friday"

Seconded B Mace
