Brian Savage is very keen to organise a flying task event over Easter at Omarama that utilises Task Pilot, the software programme he's been working on. The main goal of the event is to encourage pilots to tackle tasks (particularly for those who aren't yet active competition pilot), in order to improve their flying. There is a spirit of competition to using Task Pilot (for those interested in seeing how they go against others) although this isn't the main aim.

The idea is to have two tasks – one for less experienced pilots and one for experienced X-Country pilots, and then tiers of handicap within each task. The IT wizardry of the Task Pilot software means that there is no fancy scoring system, no rules other than those we normally adhere to when flying – literally the software works out everything. The Omarama Gliding Club is keen to support this event and we look forward to seeing our members get the most from this opportunity.

Glider Bookings



The club provides an excellent glider booking system and from all accounts our Pilot members' value being able to book a glider and to have it for the day but unfortunately we are finding some members are misusing the system. There is an expectation that if you book a glider – cancelling the glider booking with very short notice or worse – deciding not to fly on a soarable day- is not acceptable and if you are one of the culprits you are having a very adverse effect on glider

utilisation. This in turn results in less income generated and worst of all is affecting other members being able to fly. Just to be clear booking cancellations should only be done as a last resort eg you are ill or something unexpected has come up. Always be aware that if you cancel with short notice the chances of the booking being picked up by someone else is slight as most of our members need to plan a few days in advance. While there is an understanding that safety comes first and soaring conditions do not always match a Pilot's personal experience level, simply deciding, without a really justifiable reason, not to fly on a soarable day when you have booked the glider is UNACCEPTABLE.

As a result of a few members not using the booking system as intended the Executive will be putting in place a much more monitored system so expect a financial penalty in future if you are an offender!! You will be charged for one hour flying cost applicable to the glider booked.

Lack of utilisation is a major concern for the club right now and misuse of the booking system has been identified as a contributing cause. Please do your bit by adhering to the intentions and spirit of the booking system.

SI Regionals

The innovative and visionary 2017 SI Regional organising committee, headed by Nigel Davey, wanted to put in place financial initiatives to encourage young people to gain the competition flying experience and hopefully get hooked and become the contest
