THIS WEEKEND --MATAMATA--NO FLYING AT WHENUAPAI MEMBERS NEWS

SATURDAY Instructor Ivor Woodfield reports

I was duty instructor on 13th, a day which also included our club AGM and pre-season briefing. As I arrived at the gate to collect the keys, it was clear that a very cold southerly was blowing, meaning a crosswind for those flying after the meetings. The main key had already been collected by the time I arrived around 0900, so I picked up the key to the other huts and arrived at the field to find a small band of stalwarts already there. I confirmed that this keys I had collected to the packing shed no longer opened the door, so the preparation continued setting up for our meetings in the green hangar.

It was definitely very chilly as people started arriving for the meeting, and most people recovered warm clothing from their vehicles before settling down in the hangar. WGCDR Peter Thorpe ran the AGM, keeping everyone on track, and before 1100 we were moving on the briefing, run by CFI Ray Burns. We were fortunate to have a couple of guests attending the briefing, which went very well. Sunday weather wasn't bad but not great either. Thermals were strong, narrow and sparse. The sink was also quite strong and a few light showers made a nuisance of themselves. The wind was 10 - 15kts cross from the south and 25kts at 2,000 so the wind combined with the energy in the sky made for a quite a boisterous day for the few that tried it. Mark Hills gave it two goes and learnt a lot from both flights and Matt Moran also had a flight to get some more of his QGP signed off. Steve Foreman took a fashionable friend for a ride that she really seemed to enjoy and then that was it for the day. Thanks to those that derigged for Matamata while the flying was going on and to Ian O'Keefe who cooked up the AGM left overs for all to enjoy!

Towie Peter Thorpe adds to the tale: At last a flyable day so that my currency does not expire. ATIS said the surface wind was 200/15 so a brisk cross wind to test our skills and it was much the same at 2000ft. Next was Matt Moran followed by another flight for Mark. Conditions were a bit lumpy on tow but Steve managed to find some lift to extend the flights. Final flight was Steve Foreman who took a lady friend for her first flight amid lots of 'advice' about the location of the sick bag but all was well and she returned with a big smile on her face. Finished with some left over BBQ food from the AGM and headed for home soon after 1500hrs.

A note for our tow pilots - the grass is a bit long and lumpy apart from a highly visible mown strip in the centre of the official vector so you are attracted to land on it - just be aware of where the tow rope is as that approach takes you over the drains beside the hangar.


