Yvonne's Queen's birthday Honour Award Investiture



Attending the very elegant Government House in Wellington for my Queen's birthday Honours Investiture in September was a once in a lifetime experience. The Citation detailing my aviation service, and in particular to gliding, was read out before I was presented with the Member of the New Zealand Order of Merit medal by the

Governor General, Dame Patsy Reddy - a very special and memorable occasion.



Marking 50 years since the Moon landing, NASA astronaut, Dr Anna Fisher, gave an insightful and inspiring Lecture at the University of Canterbury.

Dr Anna Fisher spoke of her desire to be an astronaut when she was 12 years old but with no females being accepted into the space programme it wasn't an option when she left college so she took up medicine specialising in emergency medicine and gained a BA in chemistry. It was when NASA changed their programme to include 'specialist astronauts' that the door opened for female astronauts.

Now retired, Dr Anna Fisher is one of the first female astronauts selected by NASA in January

1978. After a year of training and evaluation she was a mission specialist on STS-51A launched 8th November 1984 becoming the first "Mum" in space as the flight followed soon after the birth of her first Daughter. During the mission the crew deployed two satellites and retrieved two for return to earth completing 127 orbits and logging a total of 192 hours in space, landing at Kennedy Space Centre on the 16th November 1984. During her career Dr Anna Fisher worked on the Space Shuttle Program, the International Space Station, and the Orion capsule that is being

developed for NASA's future Space Launch System. Additionally, she was a crew representative to support space shuttle integrated testing and payload testing. During the early phase of building the International Space Station, she was the chief of the Space Station branch.

We were given a glimpse into the future with Space Stations being established on the Moon and Mars and the new era launching capsules currently under development. I felt very privileged to meet her.
