SATURDAY Instructor Peter Thorpe got to the crayon first

At last a flying day after another four week rest due to Covid. CFI Ray Burns was there early hoping to fly the Grob G109 but found it was still blocked in the hangar so could not do so. We were going to do part of his BFR in the motor glider but reverted to the normal two flights in NF. Derry Belcher was there scraping cob webs off the tow plane before he and I taxied across to the Power Section to refuel.

By the time we got back the team of Neville Swan, Roy Whitby, Jonathan Pote, Matt Moran, Kazik Jasica, Tony Prentice and David Todd had the glider and the caravan ready on 26. Ray and I launched at 1130 for the usual 2500ft tow for a spin followed by some stalling and steep turns finishing with a no airbrake landing. Matt launched in MP



followed by David in his Ventus BZ and then Tony in VF before Ray and I could do a very short low level release flight. Kishan Bhashyam went off in MP while I briefed a new young lad Matthew Peters for his first flight. He seemed to enjoy himself and is keen to do more. Kazik and I then did two 1000ft tows to further hone his circuit flying and that was it for the day flying over by 1440.

The only excitement for the day was a lovely smooth wheels up landing by one of our pilots who shall be nameless. Fortunately our engineer Derry was on hand to supervise lifting in the approved manner to get the wheel down again. Not even a scratch to the paint so all the miscreant had to do was buy us all a wee fizzy drink as a penance - just joking, a wee human

error that could happen to any one of us even though we do try to do our pre landing checks

On preflighting DSM I noted that no elves had snuck in and fixed the port nav light or landing light (or for that matter, the ongoing sticky Bendix of the starter not engaging during startup), during lockdown and I also double-checked that no blood was left on the trailing edge of the aileron where I'd whacked my head while working in the hangar during the week doing annual inspections on GHS and GHD and a supplemental 3 monthly check on GNF so it would be ready for the weekend - one of the pitfalls of wearing a dratted mask which causes the top half of my glasses to fog up... Anyway, everything on the plane was as it was when I last flew it just before the level 3 lockdown, including not much gas in the tanks, so I grabbed Peter Thorpe to help refuel as he is authorised to use the fuel-pump at the power section.

Once we arrived back at the glider flight line on the grass runway 26 it wasn't long before Ray Burns and Peter T in GNF were being towed up to 2500 feet for Ray's BFR. A second tow with a release at 200 feet AGL completed the BFR.

Summer is on the way with some good lift about and the members that flew seemed to enjoy themselves. We carried out a total of nine flights for the day.

Thanks to those that helped, including a weight-lifting exercise at one stage.
