# SATURDAY Instructor Rex Carswell grabs the crayons first

As I looked out the window I could see it was pretty cloudy, but at least the gale force winds of Friday had mostly abated leaving a breezy sou'wester in its wake. Upon arrival at the hangar gate, car parks were filling up fast with Jonathon Pote, Roy Whitby, Andrew Fletcher and Peter Thorpe there ahead of me. Shortly after opening the hangar, arrivals included Neville Swan and student pilot Emilio Leal-Schwenk - accompanied by his father.



We set-up on grass 26 and got the first launch underway at 1125 hours. With Emilio on board, we climbed in blustery conditions to 2000 ft. Emilio was unfazed and managed the aerotow pretty well. But with little lift on offer, it wasn't long before we were back in the circuit. However, with about 30kts of sou'wester at 2000 feet, it was a great opportunity for Emilio to experience the magnitude of drift.

An hour later, the second and final launch of the day was with Jonathan in the front seat. The sky had cleared a bit and the cloud base was such that we could reach 2500ft. The wait was worth it - cloud streeting was evident and with it - good patches of thermal lift. The flight was great - Jonathan flew and I looked at the scenery. However, a P3 Orion was due to arrive and would by flying circuits for awhile, so we terminated our jaunt. None the less, a satisfying 30 minutes was easily achieved.

Other attendee's on the field at varying times were Clare Dickson, Ray Burns, Tony Prentice, Kazik Jasica and Gus Cabre. Gus flew with Peter in the tug on the final launch. All done and dusted - clear of the field by 1330 hours.

#### And Instructor Peter Thorpe adds:

The weather was not that promising with the ATIS reporting 220/16 on the ground and 220/30 at 2000ft. However, Jonathan was guarding the gate as usual and instructor Rex Carswell was getting things ready assisted by Roy Whitby, Tony Prentice and Neville Swan. Roy needed a BFR although he was not very enthusiastic about the weather but a young chap Emilio was keen to fly.



We launched just before 1130 with Rex and Emilio in NF and enjoyed a stiff cross wind take off and fairly boisterous tow to 2000ft. ATC was on watch with our old friend Adam Lawson at the microphone so no problems there. Roy decided against doing a BFR in the conditions and we nearly did not have any other customers but then Gus Cabre, our new budding tow pilot arrived and Jonathan kindly offered to do a flight so that we could at least start Gus training.

Unfortunately the intercom was not working in DSM so that made talking difficult then Adam complained that our transponder was not operating so there was much knob twiddling and switch flicking which seemed to restore its operation but was very distracting to both of us in the aircraft and did nothing to help Gus learn how to be a tow pilot. All finished by 1300 so off home early.

#### SUNDAY Towie Derry Belcher starts off

When I arrived at the field, Andrew Fletcher was already waiting at the gate, itching to get in and rig GKT, and Jonathan Pote was set up recording those turning up.

Instructor Lionel arrived shortly after, and quite a few regulars also started turning up and we proceeded to open the hangar and extract the merchandise. Roy Whitby was keen to do his BFR, Toni Thompson, Tony Prentice, Kazic Jasica, Neville Swan, Ray Burns and Kishan Bhashyam all helped get things moving and we moved everything to the 08 end of the runway.

DSM was preflighted, and with 70 litres of fuel on board, I hoped we had enough to last till Peter Thorpe came out later... Three tows were done in quick succession before we had to refuel. Luckily the ASC power section captain Ross MacPherson was visiting our side and kindly offered to supervise the refuel, saving Peter from having to come out earlier, so my thanks to Ross. We flew 12 flights for the day. I managed a lunchbreak about 14:15.

The day served up some good-looking streets. Cloudbase varied a bit but was around 3000 feet. We won't talk about 08 and the crosswind from the north.

Everyone seemed to have a good day, nicely rounded off with a wind-down in our clubroom. I much appreciated Roy's help at the end of the day with cleaning the towplane.

Instructor Lionel Page continues......Sunday dawned a beautiful clear blue day. Headed out to the field, picked up a radio and the keys from Base Ops. Arrived at the gate to plenty of eager campers.

The fleet was shortly DI'd and GKT rigged. They were all dragged to 08 as it was a fairly brisk easterly. First up was Andrew Fletcher in KT followed by Kazik Jasica in VF.

Roy Whitby was next for the first flight of his BFR. A bit of spinning, thermalling, more attempted spinning, more thermalling while everyone else seem to be falling out of the sky - not sure why as we seem to stay up without too much issue. Completed the flight with a brakes lock open exercise. Nicely executed.

Roy got his obligatory low level release next to complete his BFR - all good to go for another 2 years.

Peter Thorpe took MP up for some aeros and managed the longest flight of the day with just over an hour. (As he said - he did tow to 3,000ft but his flight was still well over the next best at 41 minutes.)

I took a new pilot (Will) up for primary effects of controls and we even managed to get a few thermals in to boot.

Final flight with a long landing was Jonathan Pote. All packed away and we headed to the new club rooms for a refreshment and natter.

The saga of the day was yet to come: Derry kindly offered to take the keys back for me but in the process managed to inadvertently dismantle gate 61's key. Much anxiety ensued (mainly by a friendly base security guy who called me to say that I needed to get it sorted - really not sure how I was going to "sort it".) Long story short, after a first call to his CFIness to see if he had any clever ideas, I then call Bill, our CEO - who very smartly had it all "sorted". Thanks Bill.

However, there are a number of other changes that are important that you need to know. There are a number of changes that relate to towing operations. These changes affect ALL Members.

Covid has made it difficult to produce hard copies of both the MOAP and the SOP and the copies in the caravan are now out of date. The latest MOAP can be found on the GNZ web site. I endeavour to make hard copies available in the caravan as soon as I can get into my office (without a four hour transit time!!)


