Use of non certified GPS sources in connection with ADS-B installations in gliders

Gliding New Zealand met with CAA today (14th October) to work out a path to ADS-B installation for gliders.

We met with Dave Harrison, Jason Ashworth, and Rens Molenaar. From the meeting, you may be interested in the following:

CAA intends to publish the updated Notice (NTC-091 - 258) in the next few weeks. This will give them the legal mechanism to consider approving non-TSO GPS position sources for ADS-B systems.

CAA lack the band width to assess individual systems and want to follow the notice with some document giving the generic criteria for systems to show compliance. This means manufacturers and users can be certain of what is required, and I presume also means that individual applications from manufacturers for approvals will not be required. No other details at this stage, but that's the plan, which I think is good news for those hoping to use GPS receivers based on the Aspen chip set. As always, no timescale.

I have to say the meeting was very productive, open and straightforward. A good experience.

We wait to see the outcomes.

Drury Runway Designation

Members will be aware that a Drury airfield map has been available in AIP format for some years on our website.

During a recent update for subsequent publication in the Aeronautical Information Publication (AIP), a survey has been carried out by Aeropath using Google Earth, the exact orientation of the runway centreline has been determined to be 017.42 degrees True, from which we must subtract local variation of 20.6 degrees to arrive at new magnetic designations of our **Runway of 18/36.**

This is not an unusual revision, as the earth's magnetic survey does change over time.

The Drury chart will be published in the AIP from 25 Feb 2021, however we need to get used of the new designations in our radio calls from now and edit the change into our manuals.


