This article is a brief description of discussions at the recent committee meeting on 14th July 2021.

Private Hangar Owners – Accounts have gone out as per last year's rates – however a rate increase will happen for the next period to keep in line with rates increases etc.

Working Bee – No new date set yet – jobs still pending please send ideas to Ross.

AGC Gliders — Although we have been attempting to keep the glider trailers current with Rego & WoF — there could well be some error (it is a voluntary system remember) — so if you intend to use a glider down in Matamata or elsewhere, be sure to check for yourself — it is a collective responsibility.

Payment system for tow fees – As from June 1st this was put into practice and so far, so good. The tow pilots have decided that tow height and rego/pilot information should be relayed BY RADIO CALL to the tow pilot.

Duo Re-location next season – this is building in momentum and a list of interested members is being populated. See the newsletter last week and or contact Ross for more info.

The Field is closed currently – however this may change at short notice – this is the vagary of weather and if the field is airworthy then we would fly here if those involved are confidant it is safe. However, AK and BI are already at Matamata, and we would like the instructors to discuss assisting our trainees by being available there. The committee will be discussing this with Russell

asap and send relevant information via email and the website.

DX – If DX goes down to Matamata it needs to be brought back to Drury for routine maintenance next week (i.e., 19th July).

Fees and Rates 2021-2022 Period – There are some changes this year and they have been approved at our meeting, so invoices will soon be following. This will be the subject of a separate information bulletin.

Aircraft – after doing some financial exercises it is indicating that the two-seat aircraft are indeed of value to our club, and another would get utilised. The idea is still alive however and we will look at options in this respect.

Mid-Winter Dinner – the numbers are climbing for this event – we have a guest speaker by way of Vaughan Ruddick who has many successes in NZ at competition flying as well as some spectacular flying – in Omarama and at his home base from Paraparaumu and Masterton.

For the student pilots, don't forget the rest of the Winter Lecture series. The exams in Met and


Human Factors are up next for anyone who wishes to sit.

This year we've got new airspace approved, which will be active from the 2nd December. Rough charts follow below showing our new and modified areas.


We've just finished negotiating our latest MoU with Bay Sector team in airways last week, and also confirming our event timetable with the Auckland Approach sector.


In good news the MoU drops all the combo restrictions that we used to have, but they reserve the right to add some in the future if needed.


This must not to be used before 2nd December 2021, but the news is that the Maramarua GAA G253 will be dis-established from that date.
