Club News

RED Traffic Light Setting

Obviously on Sunday we heard there is a change in the Traffic Light Settings as a result of the Omicron outbreak. For those wishing to continue to fly, the club will operate at this point in time. This is subject to immediate change due to an escalating outbreak and whether instructors and tow pilots are available.

Key reminders

- You must be Fully Vaccinated to be on Base and at the Club.
- You need to have My Vaccine Pass App on your phone or the official paper certificate as verification.
- Don't come the club if you have COVID symptoms, are unwell, have a household member isolating from COVID or you been at a Location of Interest where you should isolate.
- Maintain Physical Distancing and Mask Wearing and Hand Washing.

Masks are essential to prevent airborne infected aerosol from an infected person when you sneeze, cough talk etc. Bandanas, scarfs are not acceptable and fabric masks are poor. So, ensure you turn up with an appropriate surgical mask or P2/N95 and wear it properly. You are protecting others when you do so. Communication in controlled airspace

Please do not forget that all communication in controlled airspace (134.50) should go through the tower. If you want to talk to glider base or another glider then a request from the controller is required first. Keep your transmissions short and to the point.

Please be sensible - do not pick a time when the airspace is busy such as power traffic in the circuit. Also do not pick a time when either the police or a rescue helicopter is transiting the zone. They are priority traffic for the controller.

The handheld radios are intended for this use, so please take one. Students - check with the instructor first. 133.55 is the frequency that should be used.

Weekend Reports

Saturday - "Dash" Andrew Fletcher

I started the morning in a very civilised way at our local cafe for breakfast with Ray, Kishan and Kazik. After that I opened up and the gliders were given their D.I, runway 08 was in use so the launch point was set up.

The first flight got away with myself and Jonathan Pote for circuits, three of them in a row. There was a cross wind from the left to give a little challenge for landing which Jonathan handled well.

Next up, Emilio Leal Schwenke for a check ride having completed his first solo last time. We launched for a circuit that was very well flown. After we landed the back seat was secured and I sent Emilio up on his own for a nice soaring flight that lasted 41 minutes.

While all this was going on the pundits were taking to the sky's, Ray Burns in GBU for a flight of 176 minutes, Tony Prentice 82 minutes, Alex Micheal in GMP 108 minutes, Kazik Jasica 117 minutes, Ivor Woodfield in GVI 156 minutes, Matt Moran in GMP 93 minutes including some paddock inspections in the Muriwai area and Craig Best in GMP 41 minutes.

For me, 4 X trial flights in a row all went well with all getting a soaring flight lasting around 30 minutes.

I finished off with a flight for a friend from work, Amanda is a flight attendant on the Dash 8 fleet, she had been talking about gliding for the last few months. Today seemed like a good day to make it happen, Amanda arrived at 1700. We towed into a flat sky unfortunately but nevertheless had a good flight, Amanda had a go on the controls for the first time after watching pilots at work do it for years, she did well, I don't think I would be any good doing the tea and coffee service at work if I swapped rolls with Amanda.
