

Here's an update on committee work, along with a request for you to respond to the forthcoming survey.

The committee will meet at the club next weekend, as Zoom meetings are - while useful - not the same as being together.

It is hoped that the work done at this meeting will allow the AGM to be held much earlier than usual, still within the July to September window specified in the Club's rules. This is an effort to give the AGM the chance to discuss the setting of Club subscriptions, rather than simply being informed of them after they've been set.

The impact of Covid is certainly being felt in Club finances. Even with the Covid support payment received from the Government, the financial results for this year will be the worst for the last decade.

The creeping urbanisation of the Drury area is the elephant in the room: the new valuation for the Club has nearly doubled. In turn, this will lead to higher rates bills, which will have to be funded via subscription increases. The club is in a similar position to some retired people: asset-rich but cash-poor.

This urban growth has led to the committee asking Hadleigh to create another team - similar to that which opposed the Mill Road extension - to consider options for relocation of the Club. This is being started earlier than might be considered necessary to ensure that the Club has plans in place and can take advantage of any opportunities which may arise while mitigating any threats.

The survey which you'll receive a link later today is an important means of two-wav communications - what members want from the Club and what they're able to contribute to it. The Club has a backbone of members who do most of the work needed to run the club. One of the goals of the survey is to find a way to better spread that load, to ensure succession planning and to not overtax people such that they burn out. l'd appreciate having responses by Wednesday next week, so that I can collate them for the committee meeting. SurveyMonkey suggested that it would take 14 minutes to complete the survey; about the same length as two aerotows (e.g. the two I had in quick succession during the Drury comp where I accidentally released at 1,000' instead of 2,000'). Please make the time to reply, as it's your voice we want to hear.

As always, if you want to talk, feel free to call me, bearing in mind that survey responses are still needed to have the data to form views.

I'll conclude by making the point that I recall Maurie Honey making at an AGM a couple of years ago: "The Club is not the committee; it's all of us".

GPS trackers that show up on the Gliding.net.nz/tracking glider tracking site. These units are small and only require you to install a


sim card of your choice and connect to the glider's battery power (turns on with your instruments). These are the same units that AGC
