Things to need to bring gloves, weed eaters, old clothes, paint brushes, a good sense of humour.


Some of the jobs we need to do are;

Instructor Steve Wallace arrived but nobody else, so after refuelling and DI-ing the tow plane and doing a bit of talking we packed up and went home.

Sunday 20th Nov- Andrew Fletcher Reports

The weather forecast for Sunday 20th did not look good, rain was forecast by 1200. I kicked off the day with breakfast at our local with Ray and Peter.

We opened up at around 0900 shortly joined by Jonathan Potential, Igor, Tony Prentice, Craig Best towing our new tractor, Izzy and Shiv. GNF was checked over and moved to the launch point ready for Igor and myself to take the first launch of the day. The cross wind was brisk, so

Next up was Jonathan Pote, we towed to 2500 feet and managed to find a good thermal to climb back to our release altitude enabling the flight to be extended to almost 30 mins.

Rain showers were now passing through so we tied GNF down and sheltered, the weather did not improve much and before long I could hear thunder in the distance. We packed up before the heavens really opened and went home.

On Sunday I volunteered to stand in for Fletcher McKenzie who had some major domestic chores to do. Again, the cadet flying was cancelled, but Andrew Fletcher, Ray Burns and I met for breakfast at the Puriri Cafe before opening the field. We were soon joined by Craig Best towing a trailer with a new (to us) Fergy tractor which the club has bought to replace the old red diesel tractor which is on its last legs. The new acquisition runs well and CFI Ray could not wait to give it the CFI good seal of approval after a zoom around the hangar. His eyes lit up with glee at the thought of hydraulics that work and how they might be used with a suitable tray on the back.



The weather was a bit blustery with wind from the Nor West with rain showers, but Igor was keen to fly so just before 1100 we launched into a rather turbulent air at low level. They did not stay up for long as Jonathan went up with Andrew at 1130. Izzy and Shiv were keen to have a go and after sitting out a quite violent rain squall and drying off the aircraft were ready to go when Andrew eyed the approaching dark clouds and decided to cancel further flying and pack up. A good decision but about five minutes too late as everyone got wet putting the aircraft away – except for me, as while I was writing up the log the team pushed RDW and me into the hangar. Another round of drying off the two aircraft before we went home.
