Weekend Report

It was wet, damn wet, real wet, wet wet wet.... So, no flying took place over the long weekend. I am sure you guessed that.

However Steve Wallace did do some flying at Omarama and competed in the Sth Island and did quite well. Here is Steve's story,

With the Auckland weather being a bit rubbish my decision to head South and compete in the NZ MultiClass Nationals out of Omarama was a wise one. In the bottom of the South they have had one of their best summers on record. My co-pilot / navigator Nigel Davy picked me up from Queenstown and commented that it had not rained down this way literally all summer and the ground was certainly looking dry.

For the practice day we prepped our glider (Duo Discus) and flew a 300km task at 100kph in thermals for a nice warm up. We then flew the next 7 days in a row and apart from one climb in wave to 15,000' unusually for Omarama all the rest was done in thermals, generally between 6,000' and 11,000' with speeds ranging between 80kph on the diffuclut days and 120kph on the fun days.







Tasks were between 220km for the shortest and 400km for the longest. Our main competition was Tony Van Dyk from Wellington who was flying exceptionally well but one land out on Day 6 cost him the competition and allowed myself and Nigel to take out the Racing Class win with a slim 53 point margin.





If you ever get the chance make sure you add Omarama to your bucket list as the mountain flying is certainly spectacular and the energy in the sky can be next level. Canterbury Gliding Club, Omarama Gliding Club and Kahu Soaring all have high performance two seaters and if you get in early you can score a seat. You will have a lot more fun with a lcoal who knows their way around so Duo flying is a great way to go.
