#### Weekend Reports Saturday 1 July – Steve Wallace and Peter Thorpe Report

Strong WSW winds were forecast so thoughts of a coast run started circulating. Ben Gambro enquired on Friday thus putting himself to the front of the list. I said to Ben wind strength and direction looked good but it would come down to the rain and just how big and extensive the showers may be. I let Pete Thorpe know that a coast run may be on so we had a tow pilot secured. Come Saturday morning I picked up the gate key and then picked up Blake who was bravely walking through the heavy rain showers on his way to the club. Just to prove they had no common sense Craig and Roy also turned up to observe the preparations. We got the twin out, DI'd it and then put it back before the approaching tall and dark wall of water arrived. Looking at the rain radar showed that while there were lovely big clear patches between the rain of about an hour in duartion, the rain was coming in long lines of heavy rain that stretched for up to



50kms up and down the coast. We waited for three of these bands to come through before deciding that descretion was the better part of valour and the risk of getting trapped on the coast by one of these long heavy lines of rain was too great, so we made the decision to pack up and try again on another day. Pete did get a circuit in, in RDW so at least somebody was happy.

### Peter reports on how to dry wings

The forecast was not looking good, but duty instructor Steve Wallace texted me to say he was hoping for a West Coast run so I duly arrived at 0930. Steve and a bunch of young students were there looking hopeful, so I prepped RDW. I had purchased an electric pump to make refuelling easier and while it is not perfect, I was able to transfer the contents of a 20 litre container into the aircraft while I was standing on the ground rather than balancing on a ladder. That is a big improvement. A rain squall came through while the tug was outside, and it got very wet so I planned to fly a check circuit both to dry the wings and give me a little refresher training. Steve was watching the rain radar and another rain squall came through after which I took off for my circuit. The AKL ATIS had the surface wind at 250/26 while the 2000ft wind was 230/40. It was not so strong on the ground at WP but still was going to be a sporting ride. My initial climb rate was impressive, and I reached 500ft by the end of the runway but it



was a bit turbulent. A flapless approach at 70kts seemed the prudent thing to do and it worked out fine. I taxied back to the hangar to find a decision had been taken to cancel flying which meant I was the only person to fly (2). We packed up and went home.
