Weekend Reports

Duty Instructor Izzy report for Saturday Oct 28

Saturday was scheduled as a cadet flying day, so I arrived early at the field to find Ray and Rex already up the far end getting out NW with a large crowd of cadets surrounding them. The cadets were flying in both the 109 and 103, so it was set to be a busy day. After borrowing a few cadets to get out the towplane and twin, the first 109 flight was away at 10:30 with the twin only 10 min behind. At some point during the day, due to a bad forecast for Sunday, we decided to try and get through all the cadets in one day, with each having 1 flight in each glider. Rex and I almost called it late afternoon due to some heavy looking rain coming down from the North, but thankfully it changed direction before hitting us and we could continue flying. What followed was one of the busiest days I've seen at the club, with 32 movements in total: 28 cadet flights, 2 club flights in the twin with Al and a trial flight, and 2 PW5 flights from Shiv and Tony (honours for the day go to Tony with 1:09, the next longest flight was only 23 minutes). I had 16 flights for the day which beats my previous record by 5 flights, and managed what must be a record for a glider turnaround, landing at 5:15, and taking off with the next cadet at 5:17 (credit goes to Ray for the quick turnaround of my front passenger). The last flight was down just before 6pm, with everyone out the gate by 6:30pm. Thanks to everyone who helped out, particularly Ray and Peter for the 109 flights, Rex for an impressive 18 tows, Shiv and Al for helping manage launches, and everyone else who dropped in during the day.
