As we are coming into the soaring season and good soaring weather you all need to be looking at your CURRENCY, MEDICALS, and BFR'S to make sure you are legal. If you have not flown in the last 90 days (for cross country pilots and above), and for students (a month) you will need a check flight. If you require a check flight just make a booking. For those cross country pilots, before spreading your wings and going cross country you should consider practising you short field

landings. It's not just a matter of dusting off or blowing out the cobwebs, you need to get in some practice to hone those skills.

On a safety matter, I see that some of us are getting into the habit of flying the glider to the hanger (you have not finished flying until the aircraft has come to a complete stop). This is not a good practise and in some cases leaves no room for error. Therefore, as a safety precaution, **NO** club glider is to be flown to within **50 metres** of the hangars, BBQ area or other parked aircraft. I would like to see private owners exercise the same restraint.

We had a visit from the Northern Region Operations Officer, David Moody, on the weekend of the 21st of September. He carried out my Instructor Competency Review and assessed Trace Austin for his 'A' CAT Instructor rating. Trace is not yet officially an 'A' CAT instructor until he receives the paperwork and as Gliding New Zealand is going through CAA recertification, it maybe a little while before he gets it. Bill Dawson - Final Glide



Sadly, in early September, the club was informed of the passing of Bill Dawson after a long struggle with cancer over the last five years. Bill was a valued member and friend and he will be remembered for his friendship and contributions around the club from; fence repairs, working bees and retrieves.

Bill also had a love of sailing and his Model 'A' Ford. He also contributed to the tourism industry promoting Taupo with his endeavours. Bill was a genuine character and will be greatly missed.

To Pee or not to Pee by Trace

A number of experienced soaring pilots have said that if you don't pee regularly during a summer

cross country flight, then you aren't drinking enough fluid, and dehydration is the inevitable result. This can then lead to poor decision making and an ugly outcome.

There are a number of 'Pee' options available, but the only ones that are acceptable from a safety point of view are those that don't require you to divert your attention inside the cockpit and hence away from lookout and situational awareness.



One simple solution requires readily obtainable items: For men, the first is a penile sheath, otherwise known as a male external catheter. They come in various sizes, so there will be one to suit you, and they can be either connected directly to a "pee tube", if one is installed in the glider,



or attached to a 750 - 1000ml leg bag, strapped to your leg. The leg bags can be washed out and reused, therefore, the only disposable item is the sheath.

It is a simple and easy option that makes your cross country flight much more relaxing. Order online or ask your pharmacy.

The above information is totally useless for female pilots, but "Depends" and "She-Wees" are an alternative option for you!
