What is winching like?

With a light Southerly coming up the valley there was not much lift over the airfield. Those getting away were hugging Cuthbert. I was scratching my head wondering how best to progress my XCP rating. With only 19 hours solo I am hungry for more and then moving into flying my Hornet 206. The aero tow rates have gone up again in Omarama and launching with the Sky Launch Winch has become a very economical option. Brian rang and asked if I would like to be Michael Kapps first student on the winch. At that point I realized getting up to speed and going solo on the winch was my goal for the week. Michael and I had a total of 6 flights together over two days in Duo Discus GOD. He was very patient and on the last three flights Michael had no control input on the launch or landing. I gave him a fly for a while and when he lost lift, I heard "Shiza!" from the back seat! On day three Terry Jones and I fitted a new tube in Oscar Rabbit's front wheel and towed him out to launch. Terry said I can go solo when he is happy with my flying. I did a nice first flight and felt sure he would send me solo, but no! One more please and at 500 feet 'BANG!' ~ he pulled the yellow knob! A nice rollover and a decision to land ahead earned me Terry's trust and my next flight was solo! I had a perfect launch, caught some light lift over lower Buscot followed by a nice landing. What a blast! Michael took some videos of my launch and landing on one flight in GOD. They give a very interesting perspective of a winch launch.
