Next was Ali who was keen to progress his learning and also fly another solo in NF. We did some medium banked turns and focussed on getting a good lookout going during the turns. His flying was pretty good so he went off for a 20 min solo in NF.

I took a trial flight up and then Ben G took his friend Helen for a 37 min flight.

The wind was being contrary and swung back and forth several times but then seemed to settle from the SE so we changed ends and then, of course, it went back to the SW and after a couple of launches we changed ends again.

We were then treated to the sight of Ivor actually launching in IV and he enjoyed this rare experience so much he stayed up for 2 hrs 4 mins. Keeping up the spirit of only saying good things about people we won't mention his landing J.



Ryan Semmens was next, so we went up to 2000ft for a general handling sortie to confirm he was ready for solo. I was suitably impressed so I then sent him off on his FIRST SOLO. Quite a short flight but he absolutely nailed a perfect greaser landing which definitely deserved a dowsing from the bucket brigade who were eagerly waiting. Congratulations Ryan.

Ben G went off in VF for 27 mins and then we finished the day with a quick dual refresh of Alex's back seat rating.
