New OGC Subscription:

By now most of us will have received an invoice for annual subsciptions and yes it is a shocker \$! We were given a heads up by email and at a special meeting in Omarama held at Anzac weekend. I asked our president **Alex Boyes** to write a few words to explain why it is necessary and how the volunteer discount works.

Here are Alex's words 5th June 2025:

"The club didn't take the decision to increase membership fees lightly, but these changes are designed to deliver the enhanced services that members have been asking for - improving staffing and guaranteed tow operations that will make Omarama an even better place to fly. The brilliant thing about the new structure is that it puts the choice firmly in your hands: if you're willing to contribute six days of volunteer work throughout the season, you'll enjoy a fantastic 50% discount on your next membership, bringing it down to just \$520. Whether that's helping with winch operations, ground support, maintenance, or any number of other vital club activities, your effort directly translates into significant savings while helping build the strong, reliable operation we all want. It's an approach that rewards those who put time and energy into the club whilst ensuring we can provide the top-quality, seven-day service.

It's worth recognising that OGC members and the club do a tremendous amount of work behind the scenes to make the airfield function smoothly for everyone. To ensure fairness and help cover the costs of this ongoing effort, non-OGC members will also be charged a service fee when they fly at Omarama. This creates a level playing field between the membership fees our members pay and ensures that all pilots using our excellent facilities contribute appropriately to maintaining the high standards that make Omarama such a special place to fly."

An Idea from your Captain: Introduction of daily Duty Pilot:

Most clubs have a daily duty pilot and next season the OGC is introducing this important volunteer role. Duty pilots responsibilities are still being finalised but you will know clearly what is expected of you. A roster will be displayed in the OGC office. Please write your name down on a date you can be duty pilot. Here are a few examples of what is expected of you:

- ~ Be at the grid with a hand held radio and hi viz vest well before the first tow.
- ~ Attach the tow rope and run wings as required.
- ~ Assist with time keeping as required.
- ~ Keep a situational awareness of air traffic at all times.
- ~ Be prepared to make radio calls in the interest of safety.
- ~ Work together with the winch launch point controller.
- ~ Ensure all pilots are accounted for at the end of each day.
- ~ You may fly at the end of the grid but please ask someone else to do end of day duty.
- ~ Being duty pilot will give you one day volunteer discount.


What's been going on in Omarama?:

Te Toroa Gliding Club:

The news is out: A new gliding club has been proposed in Omarama. To date there are mixed feelings about the forming of this new club. It would reduce the OGC membership quite a bit. Some are trying to understand why further segregation would be beneficial. Costs for administration and airfield infrastructure are better shared. The new club is not a foregone conclusion, as they will need to apply for and receive GNZ approval to operate. They will also need to obtain an agreement from Omarama Airfield Ltd to operate.

Regardless of what the outcome is from this proposal I am sure most OGC members see Youth Glide as a very valuable part of our club. YG offers many benefits to OGC club members through winch use; glider hire and instructing. The OGC wants youth members to feel part of our club, to be more involved in club activities and be part of the Omarama gliding scene. Youth Glide brings a refreshing age balance to our club.

Perhaps a well thought out memorandum of understanding (MOU) between the OGC and Te Toroa Gliding can be put in place. With a few changes to operations and more understanding we can surely learn to live together happily ever after. Let's think this one through and make the best possible decision.

CNC has just come out of a full recovering and repaint and is the first Pawnee in NZ with the latest spar mod AD completed and it's got a 260 hp 0540 Lycoming the same as OMA".



Who is John Teddy Smith?

In September 2022 a black V8 Audi with low profile tires burbled and scraped its way across the east end of runway 27 in Omarama. A big rottweiler was drooling out the back window with a focused looking man in dark glasses driving.

Roger Read asked:

"Who's that?!"

The man pulled up, stepped out and said:

"Hi, I'm **John Smith** and I've come to do some gliding"

Andrew Colby replied:

John had three winch flights that day with **Malcolm Wright** as instructor and fell in love! 🔻 (with gliding)

A brief history of John's flying career:

John has been a hang gliding and paragliding instructor and tandem pilot for most of his working life. During the late 1990s John became very accomplished at speed gliding. A sport where you fly at full speed down a hill through gates and around pylons. John was ranked No1 in the world for a couple of years. He represented NZ several times overseas. He came 2nd in the World Speed Gliding Champs in 2000 and 1st in the Red Bull Speed Run in Austria. John was NZ Hang Gliding champion 4 years in a row from 2015 to 2018 and has been on the podium many other times too.

John currently works for Skytrek Tandems https://www.skytrek.co.nz/ and flies both hang gliders and paragliders. Skytrek is Part115 certified and at the peak of summer employs up to 35 people. Tandem pilots own their own equipment and contract fly for Skytrek. On a good day pilots can make respectable money. On windy days when tandem flying is cancelled you will usually find John flying his LS3 in wave at Omarama.

When did you start flying Gliders?

South Canterbury in Nov 1997. I only had 19 flights. A man only has so much time and money ~ hang gliding was more affordable for me at the time. I started again in Omarama in Sep 2022 and gained my XCP after two years. Competing in the SI Regionals and the NZ Nationals I was very happy with my performance. I was grateful to receive the MtCook Air Serices Best Individual Performance SI Pilot trophy. I now have logged a total of 331 hours gliding and love it!




I know you have used Condor a lot ~ how has this helped?

I am sure it has been beneficial to my progress. It has allowed me to experience local terrain in a glider and adjust to the large performance differences from a hang glider. I think the simulation is excellent. Combined with my hang gliding and paragliding experience, Condor is a powerful tool.

We Glide:

John uploads most of his flights to Weglide. He points out that many use Online Contest (OLC). He regularly uses Weglide to analyze his flights and study other people's flights. It shows where the lines of lift are and what places work in different conditions. I like trying to understand why other pilots make decisions during a task.

Goals for the Future?

I want to "Master the Craft" and become one with the machine.

Do the best I can to explore the South Island and fly longer, faster and further.

I love competitions, they are the best way to progress skills quickly.

I would love to fly at Springfield and Nelson Lakes next season. A trip to the North Island in the future too.
