### **Base OPS Channel 7 Monitoring**

I have noticed that Duty Pilots are forgetting to turn on and monitor the channel 12 radio in the caravan. This is the ground control radio that is used by base operations.

It is most important that this radio is switched on in the morning, monitored all day, and switched off again in the evening.

Radio monitoring has been getting a bit slack recently. If you are in the caravan you must monitor the radio. If you do not know how to answer or what to say, just say "standby" and then find someone who can answer the call... as a priority.

We Tried

There was a keen group waiting at the gate when I arrived at 9.30am despite the fact that it was blowing a freezing cold southerly.

Everybody was dressed warm and ready to go so to the hangar we went and extracted the aircraft. Sophie and Lev got a good lesson on how to do a DI which was useful as the chances of flying lessons were already looking a bit shaky as base ops indicated a 16kt cross wind gusting 20kts. Before Tony could test the cross wind limits of the FK9 though a small problem that needed solving arose. RDW's oil dip-stick was missing. A bit of searching did not locate it so plan B was a piece of wire to confirm plenty of oil was present. With the



small problem sorted it was back to the bigger problem of the strong cross wind. 26 was ruled out as an option and 21 was also ruled out as we needed the tower on watch to use this vector so the thought was perhaps an angled take-off from 08. We hauled the caravan and three gliders to this end to give it a go. By the time we got to the 08 end however the average wind had increased to 18kts and a no glider test flight was needed. Tony's test flight resulted in a take-off (on the second attempt) and while he gave the landing a good look, ultimately it was aborted and the eventual landing was made on 21. It was pretty obvious that the risk of breaking something if we persisted was rather high so giving it away for the day was an easy decision. Time to go home and warm up.
