Last season I was lucky enough to have spent three months with my trusty DG-100 learning how to soar our beautiful southern alps, and during that time I fell head over heels in love with flying here and felt like I could contribute to the lovely local gliding community- who all welcomed me with open arms.

Airfield Camping Ground Opening Date:

Warren Dickinson, president of OSC, has informed me they will be opening the camping ground on Friday 26th Sept. You can pay a fee to keep your caravan on sight all season. He tells me the booking app has been upgraded.

Operational Updates for Omarama Airfield Ltd (OAL):

On 31st August OAL sent out a general letter outlining some big changes to operations at Omarama airfield. Below is my summary for those that want an overview of these changes.

- ~ The much-loved airfield café is reopening in late October.
- ~ OAL is buying tow planes OMA and CNC. They intend operating 7 days a week for 7 months from 1st Oct to 1st May.
- ~ There will be posters at the airfield and on their website with a QR code to sign up and create user accounts.
- ~ Tow rates will be the same as last season, \$19 per minute including GST.
- ~ The daily 10:00 am weather briefing will continue and all those intending to fly gliders each day are expected to attend.
- ~ The Omarama Gliding Club (OGC) has been contracted to conduct a daily operational and safety meeting at 9:30am.
- ~ The OGC will also provide a CFI, flight following, access to club facilities and emergency response coordination.
- ~ All visiting and local pilots must follow the Gliding NZ (GNZ) Manual of Approved Procedures (MOAP) and the requirements of the local host gliding club (OGC).
- ~ All pilots are required to be under supervision of a CFI or nominated person, either their own club or the OGC CFI.
- ~ OAL has land parcels on the airfield available for sale. More info at: http://realestate.co.nz/42751018/
- ~ Any questions or feedback can be directed to: directors@omaramairfield.co.nz
- ~ OAL structure and governance: OAL is limited liability company owned in equal shares by Waitaki District Council and Omarama Soaring Centre. It is Governed by four directors, two from each shareholder.
