Big News! The Omarama Gliding Club elected a new president at our AGM on 26 Oct 2025





Mike has been busy since being elected President. He held his first executive meeting on Saturday Night. I phoned him Monday night, and he agreed to a brief telephone interview there and then.

Mike was born in England and came to NZ in 1991 at the tender age of 27 years old. He planned to stay one year and is still here! He drove through to the McKenzie Basin and fell in love with the mountains. He lives in Spreydon, Christchurch with his wife and has 3 adult children. Mike is a medical doctor working as a sleep and respiratory specialist. He works with lungs and breathing. Mike has been flying 8 years. He was brought up on a farm next to an RAF base with aircraft flying overhead all the time. He was always looking at the sky and wanted to fly. He realised his dream when he took a gliding course with Glide Omarama. Phil Plane was his first instructor. "I fainted and puked on my first flights but slowly got better". During Covid, I started working towards my microlite licence. I have a share in LS4 Mike Tango.

I asked what his thoughts are for the future of the OGC: Mike says the club has a wonderful group of passionate and skilled people. He thinks it will be fun to work with these people and reenergise the gliding community in Omarama. What a completely awesome place Omarama is to fly!

This place relaxes and replemishes you. Then it offers you fun and adventure!

The Boots and Jandels Hotel with it's distictive 8 sided bar is arguably the social hub of the town. They have a big restaurant, bar and bottle store. Great food, relaxing atmosphere and awesome people watching. They also have several self contained apartments available.





On the apron of the Omarama Airfield is the all new **Glider Café**. You can litteraly land on the Omarama Airfield and taxi up for a coffee. Perfect timing with their opening too; in time for the South Island Regional Gliding Championships (from 15th to 22nd Nov.) and the busy holiday season. Pilots, locals, travelers, friends and kids will all welcome this relaxing place to be.

Early reports say "the coffee is excellent" and they serve "the best pumpkin soup".

The Merino Country Café serves great tearooms type food and has quite a good tourist shop too.



The local Four Square grocer has everthing you need with a good selection of drinks in the far corner.



And a stay in Omarama would not be complete without a kebab at Debs and a Coffee at Johns.



SECRET spot! **The Ahuriri River Bank**: ~ an old hang gliding camp site. Drive over the Ahuriri River bridge north of Omarama and past the DOC camp. There is a gate on the left that says Oamaru Anglers Club Huts. This land is public but overnight camping was stopped by DOC about 6 years ago. Drive in and turn left at the yellow huts where you will find a very serene spot on the banks of the Ahuriri River. There are superb swimming holes in the area and lovely shaded walks under the willow trees. An ideal place to take the kids for a swim, dam making and rock skipping. Take a blanket and pack a picnic. Look out for A2O cyclists as the trail goes straight through here.

The Omarama Walkway, a SECRET hidden in plain sight! Beside the Top !0 camping ground is a narrow walkway between two wooden fences. It leads down to the Omarama Stream where the millennial bridge takes you to a newly formed parkland wilderness. Ideal for dog walks with meandering tracks beside the stream. Sometimes you can see trout spawning here. You might get lucky and find the odd golf ball from the Omarama Golf Course across the road ~ visitors welcome!

Local cycle company **Trail Adventures** are located between the Omarama Fire Station and Police Station. They hire out bikes for numerous superb bike trails in the area. They told me you can hire a bike for a day and ride to Otematata taking you along the amazing A 2 O Lake Benmore ride. Here are a few places to visit and things to do within a couple of hours drive of Omarama:

This list could be endless but here are a few cool ideas in no order. Enjoy!

Drive to Queenstown for a FERGBURGER. Drive to Wanaka, check out puzzle world and walk up Mt Iron. Drive to Cromwell for lunch in the Heritage Precinct. Lunch at Oliver Restaurant in Clyde. Visit Twizel and do a little shopping. Visit the Ed Hillary Centre at Mt Cook. Walk the famous Hooker Valley Track at Mt Cook. Drive to the head of lake Ohau and take in the views up the Dobson and Hopkins Valleys. Stop for a coffee at Ohau Lodge. Drive up the Ahuriri Valley and tramp up to Canyon Creek.

Go for a swim at Lake Ruataniwha. Drive through the Danseys Pass to the Maniototo, Nasby, Alexandra, Cromwell and back to Omarama. Visit the Benmore Dam and do the Mt Cook lookout walk. Drive across the Benmore Dam and go swimming on the north side of Lake Aviemore. Boating from Sailors Cutting and through the Lake Benmore channel. Walk the Quailburn Track. Visit the Clay Cliffs. Visit the Oamaru Heritage Precinct. Visit River-T Winery in Kurow. Take a deck chair and a book to the Ahuriri River and read. Take a dog for a walk.

Or totally relax and breath crystal clear mountain air.
