Some of you may know we had a fence incursion last Saturday. Fortunately, there was no human damage apart from pride, but the glider did sustain some damage.

This all came about by trying to land long to be close to the car.

It's a good time to remind everyone that a long float length of half the strip or more is not a good way to practice landings.

One should always be practicing for an out landing. On that basis, pick your aiming point and set up a half effective brake approach and round out on the aiming point, hold off and land.

For XCP pilots and above you can close the brakes and taxi off, just don't cross the drive. For solo and soaring pilots land straight, get out of the glider and push it off asap.

The weather for Saturday is looking a little unsettled in the morning but improving in the afternoon with around 10kt SW winds.

Sunday looks similar with slightly less wind. There may be large areas of cloud cover of Stratocumulus on both days.

Soaring should still be on the cards, but XC will be limited.
